Moved by Joe Montag, seconded by Chris Newton to adopt Resolution #2025-20, a Resolution Approving Agreement And Contract For Fire Protection And Emergency Response Services With Garfield Township. Roll call of vote, “Ayes” – Joe Montag, Chris Newton, Grant Gearhart, Linda Tilges, Brooke Winkelhorst; “Nays” – None. Resolution duly adopted.

APPLICATION FOR OUTDOOR DISPLAY OF FIREWORKS/PYROTECHNIC SPECIAL EFFECTS – J & M DISPLAYS:

Moved by Joe Montag, seconded by Brooke Winkelhorst to approve the application submitted by J & M Displays, Inc. and sponsored by the West Bend Chamber of Commerce for outdoor display of fireworks/pyrotechnic special effects to be held on July 5, 2025. Roll call of vote, all present voting in the affirmative. Motion carried.

APPLICATION FOR TRANSIENT MERCHANT LICENSE – BRICK & EMBER PIZZA COMPANY:

Moved by Brooke Winkelhorst, seconded by Linda Tilges to approve the application submitted by Brick & Ember Pizza Company for a (one day) transient merchant license, effective Friday, April 18, 2025. Roll call of vote, all present voting in the affirmative. Motion carried.

FIRE DEPARTMENT – MINI PUMPER UPGRADE:

The West Bend Fire Department received a grant from PACGDC, in the amount of \$16,470.00 to make updates to the mini pumper truck. The firemen had obtained a quotation from Heiman Fire Equipment for a slide-in unit last December when applying for the grant but have since been

told that the price has increased by 15%. The West Bend Fire Department met and decided that they would like to move forward with the purchase of the equipment pending City Council approval. The cost of the slide-in unit will be \$21,142.75. Additional costs associated with the project include the installation of the slide-in unit and fuel injection kit by Raw Customs. The West Bend Fire Department will be responsible for the grant cash match as well as the added cost associated with the equipment price increase. Moved by Chris Newton, seconded by Brooke Winkelhorst to approve the purchase of a slide-in unit for the West Bend Fire Department mini pumper truck from Heiman Fire Equipment, in the amount of \$21,142.75. Roll call of vote, all present voting in the affirmative. Motion carried.

POLICE REPORT:

Police Chief, Anthony Laubenthal submitted his monthly report to the City Council. Last month MART was held in Estherville. Tactical exercises were performed, and the recertification of firearms was completed. Next month MART will be held in Algona. Anthony is participating in an online Police Legal Sciences Program. The Police Chief is attending a SOTA conference in St. Cloud, Minnesota from April 12th through April 15th. The new taser has been ordered. The calls for the month were reviewed. There have been several miscellaneous measurements taken and two building permits were processed. The City Council asked that Anthony research the City Code of Ordinances regarding motorized scooters and their use on city sidewalks and streets. There were also complaints about ATV'S traveling on Broadway Avenue. The City Council would like to see some citations issued for these violations.

ELECTRIC OPERATIONS REPORT:

Electric Operations Manager, Craig Olson prepared the Electric Operations Report for the month of March. Work that has been performed in West Bend, Graettinger and Pocahontas was listed on the report. Updates have been made to the labor and equipment hours on the spreadsheet. West Bend is currently owed \$59,573.00 by the other KOPAEG members. The Electric Operations Manager has some projects planned for the upcoming months that should use some of the credit currently owed to West Bend.

COMMITTEE REPRESENTATIVE UPDATES:

The Mayor and Council Member Linda Thilges will be attending meetings in the upcoming weeks.

COUNCIL REPORT:

The NIMECA financial statements were included in the Council packets along with the WS#4 cash request for April. The minutes from the West Bend Public Library Board Meeting and the Kossuth/Palo Alto County City Clerk's Meeting were reviewed. The City Council talked about items that could be highlighted in the Mayor's monthly article.

OTHER BUSINESS:

The Mayor inquired about the City Clerk's attendance at the West Bend Economic Development Meetings.

ADJOURNMENT:

Moved by Grant Gearhart, seconded by Linda Thilges to adjourn the meeting to Monday, April 28, 2025, at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall. Roll call of vote, all present voting in the affirmative. Motion carried.
